

FIRE SAFETY

POLICY STATEMENT

Crossland Tankers is a manufacturer of stainless steel and aluminum road tankers for the transport industry. As such the activities that are carried out on our sites can be a fire risk with the hot works and use of some flammable substances. Therefore, as a responsible employer that takes our fire safety duties seriously, we have drafted this policy to enable us to identify and comply with our legal obligations to staff and visitors under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 and The Fire Safety Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2010.

Crossland Tankers fulfils its duties under the Fire Safety Order 2005 and the Fire Regulations NI order 2010 by doing the following;


- Appointing more than one competent person to assist in the implementation of Fire Safety throughout our premises and for our employees. When entrusting fire safety tasks to employees, we will take into account their capabilities in relation to Health, Safety and Fire Safety.
- Fire Risk Assessments are undertaken at periodic intervals on the premises and the substances used. The results of the Fire Risk Assessments are reviewed to ensure any recommendations are acted upon and the risks are eliminated or reduced as far as reasonably practicable.
- Fire detection equipment, alarms and firefighting equipment is provided as per the recommendations of the Fire Risk Assessment.
- Fire Procedures are identified, documented and communicated to all employees and visitors on Crossland Tankers sites.
- Fire Drills are carried out at regular intervals by appointed Fire Marshalls on the site. Results of the fire drills and lessons to be learned are documented and discussed by management for corrective action.
- For any dangerous substances that are identified on site (highly flammable or explosive substances including some dusts), the risks are either eliminated or reduced as far as reasonably practicable.
- Information, instruction and training is provided to all employees at the commencement of employment on the identified fire risks, the controls, the emergency procedure and any dangerous substances which are present on site, and the identity of appointed competent persons.
- The Company documents and maintains records in relation to Fire Safety, examples of such records are;
 - ❖ Fire evacuation procedures
 - ❖ Detailed records of all fire training
 - ❖ A record of all fire drills (at least one per year) listing all attendees, evacuation times and any comments
 - ❖ Records of weekly checks and/or tests of fire alarms, fire exits, fire extinguishers and fire routes
 - ❖ Record of annual inspection and test of all firefighting equipment
 - ❖ Records of periodic tests of emergency lighting (where fitted)
 - ❖ Records of all scheduled and unscheduled maintenance of fire detection and alarm systems
 - ❖ Records of inspection, risk assessment and maintenance of workplace and electrical equipment, storage of hazardous substances and other hazards identified with fire safety

Employees have a general duty to take reasonable care for themselves and others, to cooperate with fire safety measures implemented by their employer, and to inform their employer and colleagues of any situation they become aware of which presents a serious and immediate risk, or which represents a shortcoming in the employer's fire safety measures.
